





Yonisomanasikāra: Critical reflection

Dhammānudhammapatipatti: practice in perfect conformity to the Dharma or to the principle

- Whoever through desire, hate or fear, or ignorance never transgresses the Dhamma, All his glory ever increases like the moon during the waxing fortnight.






